ADAM WENGERT: I think being able to have clear guardrails for anything that we're doing that has the possibility of a variable answer, that we understand, for example, how confident an LLM was in its response.

We have access to all that information, especially in my world with Microsoft Boundary. It will tell us, "Hey, I'm only 60% confident in this answer, you may not want to rely on it."

And that would be an example of a governance and management plan that we simply have to have in place for everything. From there, you can start to build really detailed guardrails in specific areas to make sure those hallucinations are weeded out.
